### Workshops to make the display items for the gabion wall

This year we are making fewer items to be displayed along the entrance to the Village Centre, showing the national symbols of **Chile**. We are also featuring the seven Arboretum forests of trees that are native to Chile. We still need volunteers to help create the items. In addition, we will hold our knitters circle meetings in the room at the same time.

### More skinny scarves please

Last year we received a comment that some people have friends or relatives who are not able to walk very far, but love to see the scarves around the trees when taken for a drive at the Arboretum. So we thought we would wrap some scarves around trees that grow along the roads. We would like a few more skinny scarves, between 12 and 15 cm wide and 1 metre long. As usual, any colour, including those of the Chilean flag - red, white and blue.

### Final date for scarves

Can you please deliver your finished scarves no later than **Monday 17 June**, preferably earlier if possible. We plan to start installing them from Saturday 22nd June. As in previous years, it is best if you can take them to the Arboretum and leave them at the Information Desk. If you are interstate, please post them to:

### Distribution of wraps from last year

We still have some wraps that we received rather late last year, so I decided to wait until the weather was cooler before distributing them. So a couple of questions – would you like to

nominate a particular charity or retirement village or nursing home that you think could make use of some wraps? Perhaps you know someone living in one, or you have been particularly impressed by a charity?

I am also looking for one or two volunteers to help me deliver them. And given the signs that the weather is getting cooler at last, the sooner the better.

### **How long does it take to knit or crochet a scarf?**

You might remember I asked this question last year and was inundated with replies - NOT! So how about timing how long it takes you to knit, say, 30 rows of a 25 cm wide scarf, which is approximately 10 centimetres in length, and let me know the time it took you? If your 30 rows are significantly longer or shorter than 10 centimetres, please let me know the length too. This will enable me to make a more realistic estimate of the number of hours that Warm Tree volunteers are contributing to the Arboretum.

### **And finally**

Thanks again for your involvement in Warm Trees. It is a significant event for the Arboretum and encourages people to get outside to walk among the forests, at a time when they might not want to go outside. And of course the extra number of visitors helps increase revenue, which in turn helps the ongoing maintenance and operation of our wonderful Arboretum.

Please contact me if you have any questions, or any suggestions, or can help with distributing wraps, and of course to let me know how long it takes you to knit 30 rows!
