Pelargonium Sp. Striatellum Omeo Storksbill. A yet to be formally named endangered species.



Brachyscome spathulata Spoon-leaved Daisy with a tiny green Aphididae (family) Aphid.



Chrysocephalum apiculatum Common Everlasting. A hardy perennial Daisy with many forms.





Crowea exalata Ginninderrs Falls. A most attractive, colourful long flowering local species.



Ranunculus papulentus Large River Buttercup. Spreads by rhizomes and appreciates moisture.



Leucochrysum albicans. An attractive daisy with white or yellow ray florets. Grows well on gravelly well drained surfaces.



Gymnopilus junonius Spectactular Rustgill. Growing at the base of *Eucalyptus viminalis*.



Ammobium alatum Winged Everlasting. A perennial Daisy that reseeds readily. Is considered weedy.



Solanum linearifolium Mountain Kangaroo Apple. A tall woody shrub that readily reseeds.

Podolepis jaceoides Showy Copper Wire Daisy. A long flowering perennial daisy that attracts insects.

Pterygophorus cinctus Bottlebrush Sawfly. These are active on our Callistemon species.
